OPUS

Announced at the 2021 National Convention, OPUS is our next-generation membership portal which replaces the Online Membership & Reporting System (OMRS). We are pleased to announce that OPUS successfully launched during the 2023 National Convention Banquet and that the OMRS has been retired. Members began receiving login information at that time, and all members should have received login information by August 1. Please ensure you (and all active chapter members) have logged in and updated your information. It is imperative that all members are able to log in to OPUS as we will no longer collect physical signatures for paperwork. Instead, members will receive a notification to log in to OPUS to review and accept the policies in-system. If you have questions about logging in to OPUS, please contact Aaron Moore (moore@kkytbs.org) or Nicole Brooks (brooks@kkytbs.org).

Our OPUS development team members continue their work to migrate all data from the OMRS over to OPUS. If you believe information is missing on your personal or chapter profile, please check back to see if it has been updated. Our priority is to have all initiations, memberships, and officers roles loaded in order for chapters to successfully complete the Chapter Personnel Report. Past chapter forms, as well as awards, will be added over the next couple of months.

Updated training materials for OPUS are in the works as well. This <u>YouTube Playlist</u> contains OPUS training videos. As new videos are recorded, they will be added to this playlist.



Chapter Personnel Report

The 2023-2024 Chapter Personnel Report for your chapter is now available for submission in our new Online Membership System: OPUS. The names that are pre-populated on this form are members who were Active, Associate, Conditional, or were reported as new initiates during the 2022-2023 academic year. Use the "Members to Add" section for any additional names that may be missing from the list (If a member is transferring to your chapter, please complete the Transfer Member Form prior to submitting your Chapter Personnel Report in order to verify their status, and have their name added to your report. The form can be found here). If chapters have Initiate Registration Forms that are still pending in OPUS, those will need to be completed before starting the Chapter Personnel Report. Be sure to fill out the membership status of each person listed, even if it is "inactive" or "alumni." The Chapter Personnel Report also includes an expected graduation date. This field is required for each member reported as Active, Associate, or Conditional. Some other items to remember:

- Prior to beginning the Chapter Personnel Report, please ask each of your chapter members to log in to OPUS to check their name, address, and personal email address (the use of a non school affiliated email address in OPUS is recommended). Each member has their own account and should verify that the correct information is included on their profile.
- Signed signature pages are no longer required when submitting the Chapter Personnel Report. When a completed form is submitted for Sponsor approval, each member listed on the form will receive an email asking them to verify their contact information and acknowledge the risk management terms and conditions. After the approval of the Director of Bands, your reports and forms will show a status of either "Submitted to Headquarters" or "DOB Approved, Pending Collection of Fees". If the form shows the "DOB Approved, Pending Collection of Fees" status, you will need to verify that all members have acknowledged the policies, at which time you will update the status to "Form & Payment Sent to National Headquarters.
- Payment, must then be mailed to the National Headquarters or paid online by September 30th for the form to be considered On-Time.
- OPUS will automatically determine whether your submitted forms are to be considered Early, On-time, or Late based on the date that the form is submitted to National Headquarters for processing. If sending by mail, the payment must be postmarked by the deadlines or the status of the submission will be changed to late, regardless of when the online form was set to a status of "Form & Payment Sent to National Headquarters."



Chapter Personnel Report Cont.

- PAYMENT METHOD FOR OPUS: Payments for the Chapter Personnel Report and/or the Chapter Personnel Update can now be accepted as follows:
 - BY MAIL: Check or Money Order Mailed to National Headquarters with a printed copy of the form payment is being submitted for.
- BY PHONE/FAX: By credit card over the phone when you call National Headquarters at 405-372-2333. All policy acknowledgments must be completed in OPUS before calling.
- ONLINE: By credit card or eCheck ONLINE by clicking on the following link. A PDF copy of the form payment is being submitted must also be attached.

Officer and Chapter Update Form

If your chapter held elections before August 31, please make sure that the Officer & Chapter Update is submitted and approved no later than August 31. If you hold elections after September 1, please submit the Officer & Chapter Update after the Chapter Personnel Report has a Transaction Confirmed or Transaction Completed status.

Additional Information on Fees and Dues

CHAPTER FEE & MEMBER DUES: During our biennial National Convention, the delegation voted to increase membership and initiate fees by \$15(reflected in the table below). This increase was necessary to offset the costs of insurance increases and to continue to support vital programming for the Sorority. It is encouraged that fees and dues, along with correctly completed forms, be submitted on or before SEPTEMBER 15th* of each year. Chapters that do not complete their online submission and postmark their signed summary page and fees by September 30th will be considered late. The Chapter will be assessed a late fee of twenty-five percent (25%) of the total member dues and chapter fee; see the table below for amounts. Chapters who submit late fees or paperwork may be placed on probation. Chapters that do not pay within 30 days of the deadline will be suspended.



The fee schedule for Tau Beta Sigma is as follows:

^{*} Chapters at schools on the quarter system should report their dues by October 1 (late fees will be due if the report is submitted after October 15) and will need to include proof from their university of their late starting date.

Be an "Early Bird." Submit your completed Chapter Personnel Report online and submit the signed summary page and fees with a postmark of September 15th or earlier and your chapter will receive an "Early Bird 2023" certificate. (Quarter Schools may use a September 30th postmark.) The term "Submitted" in regards to OPUS will be considered the date that the form is stepped to a status of "Form & Payment Sent to National Headquarters" as long as the accompanying fees and signatures are also postmarked by that date.

INITIATE FEES: An Initiate Registration Form must be submitted through OPUS, and the signed Summary Page and fees must be postmarked within thirty (30) days of initiation. Failure to submit the fees within the thirty (30) day period will result in a twenty-five percent (25%) late fee being assessed on the total number of initiates. If the late fee is not included, there will be a delay in processing the initiates; see the above table for amounts.

We encourage each chapter to be proactive in meeting all financial and administrative obligations by the prescribed deadlines and if possible, early. If the National Council can assist your chapter in this regard, please let us know.

Thank you to all of the individuals who submitted amendments to the National Constitution! The updated Constitution will be available on the Tau Beta Sigma website at http://www.tbsigma.org/resources by September 2023. Some notable changes included:

- Changing the name of our Chapter Visitation Assistants to Chapter Visitation Associates.
- Taking out any remnants of paper copies of anything being mailed to our current practice of electronic communication.
- Reflecting the current practice of giving Directors of Bands ultimate decision making for their band program/chapter.
- Reflecting the current practice of placing Chapters who do not pay their dues on time on Suspension, rather than Probation.
- Adding more terminology for the Observation status for Chapters.
- Adding terminology that reflects the current practice of Life Members voting and electing Board of Trustees members.
- Taking out terminology regarding showing membership cards for official events to a Government Issued ID, as membership cards are no longer distributed.
- General grammatical and spelling error corrections.

2023-2024 Overture Updates

- OPUS
 - All references to the OMRS has been replaced with our new Membership Reporting System, titled OPUS.
- New Lessons
 - New information has been provided regarding our DEIA initiatives, new guidance regarding our songs from the Music Education & Musicianship committee, and also providing information about our Tau Beta Sigma Alumni Association.
- History
 - The 2023-2024 version of Overture has expanded information on TBSigma History throughout the curriculum to include information on Historically Black Colleges & Universities (HBCUs) and other minority-serving institutions where we have chapters of TBSigma.
- More about the Five & Eight
 - Our shared values included in the Eight Essential Factors and Five Qualities have been expanded throughout the curriculum as discussion topics in most lessons and introductory information in Module One.
- Overall Setup
 - The lessons in each module has been reorganized for a better flow and opportunity for mastery from Membership Candidates and their Educator.

National Vice President for Special Projects Updates

Join Us on the Tau Beta Sigma Discord Server

What is Discord?

Discord is a free communications app that lets you share voice, video, and text chat with friends and members of various online communities. It has hundreds of millions of users, making it one of the most popular ways to connect with people online. For Tau Beta Sigma, the Discord server is a dedicated place to obtain information, submit programs for consideration for the Focus on Five Campaign, and to connect with members across the country.

Why Discord?

Over the past biennium, Active Members shared challenges with fully participating in the Focus on Five Campaign due to infrequent use of Facebook as a social media platform. In response to this trend among student members, we are shifting away from social media platforms for the Campaign's purpose and toward the dedicated Discord online community and communications server.

How to Join

All members may join the Discord server to see posts and program information. It is a required step for all Chapter Focus on Five Liaisons to participate. To access the server, follow this invitation link or follow the link posted on the Tau Beta Sigma Linktree at www.linktr.ee/taubetasigma. This may prompt you to create a free Discord account.

Once joined and in the server you will be prompted through a series of set-up activities including:

- Selecting your Role (Focus on Five Liaison, Active Member, etc.)
- Review the rules of the server
- Introduce yourself
- Review Campaign information and guidelines

After set-up is complete you can participate on channels with chat threads, text/photo submissions, and voice channels. As the Focus on Five Campaign moves forward we will update the Discord to reflect the needs of the campaign and students.

The Focus on Five Campaign was created as a way to guide Chapters toward specific initiatives and activities that fulfill the Mission of the Sorority and its core operations. This biennium we will focus Chapters' work and efforts, reflect all aspects of the Mission Statement, emphasize band participation as participants and audience members, and connect Chapters to learn from one another. At it's core, this year's campaign seeks to answer the question, "How does Tau Beta Sigma make an impact on our band, campus, and greater community?"

The **Red Stripe** focuses on ensuring that we are established for the year with regard to our Chapter operations documents, awareness of risk management policies, and enrollment in the Focus on Five Campaign. There are three key steps needed to earn the Red Stripe (deadline to complete and submit tasks is October 15, 2023):

- 1. Appoint your Focus on Five Liaison and have them join the Tau Beta Sigma Discord server.
- 2. Email your Chapter Budget & Constitution to your District Counselors.
- 3. As a Chapter, watch the TBSigma Risk Management Policy Video and complete the "Take a Stand" cards, preferably during National Hazing Prevention Week (September 25-29, 2023). Share a photo of the Chapter's Take a Stand cards in the Discord server.

The White Stripe focuses on community development within our Mission Statement. Our community extends from our band program, to our campus, to our greater communities. Tau Beta Sigma's National Programs were created with the specific aim to support various aspects of the Mission. There are two programs that target our engagement within the community: Crescendo and Coda. There are two steps to earn the White Stripe (deadline to complete and submit tasks is June 1, 2024):

- 1. Host either a Crescendo or Coda event within your community.
- 2. Share photos (if able based on the community partner's guidelines) and details of the event and answer the questions "How did this event impact our community? What does it mean to our Chapter? How did Tau Beta Sigma make a difference?" in the Discord server.
 - a. If photos are not allowed, complete the appropriate Participation Form located in the TBSigma National Programs Guide and have it signed by an official from the community partner organization.

*Chapters are not restricted to host only one program. However, only one is required to earn the White Stripe.

The **Blue Stripe** focuses on the empowerment of women in music within our Mission Statement. The Women in Music Speaker series is the hallmark National Program of Tau Beta Sigma. It was created with the intent of giving women in music a platform to speak and share their experience. It is also an opportunity to connect our members, bands, and greater community to these music professionals and to learn from their story. There are two steps to earn the Blue Stripe (deadline to complete and submit tasks is June 1, 2024):

- 1. Host a Women in Music Speaker Series for your band program, campus, and/or greater community.
- 2. Share photos and details of the event and answer the questions "How did this event impact our community? What does it mean to our Chapter? How did Tau Beta Sigma make a difference?" in the Discord server.



The **Green Stripe** focuses on cultivating leadership in our Chapter and band community. Developing leadership skills within a band program can greatly enhance the overall performance and success of the group. While there is not a current National Program that focuses on this aspect of the Mission, Tau Beta Sigma can enhance leadership within the band program and community through setting examples of positive leadership and facilitating development events for band members (suggested topics below). There are two steps to earn the Green Stripe (deadline to complete and submit tasks is June 1, 2024):

- 1. Host a leadership development event for members of the band program.
- 2. Share photos from the event and answer the questions "How did this event impact our community? What does it mean to our Chapter? How did Tau Beta Sigma make a difference?" in the Discord server.

Suggested topics for the full band include: Effective Communication, Team Building/Collaboration, Goal Setting and Planning, Time Management and Organization, Emotional Intelligence, and Personal Reflection and Growth. Suggested topics for Band Leaders include: Conducting and Leading Rehearsals, Conflict Resolution and Mediation, Decision Making/Problem Solving, and Mentoring/ Coaching.

Members of Tau Beta Sigma are not required to be the primary content presenters/facilitators of the event to earn the Green Stripe. It is encouraged to partner with campus resources including the student activities office, Greek life, or other professional services to bring content expertise and also to connect band members with resources across the campus community. Alumni members in good standing can present with approval from the Director of Bands.

The **Black Stripe** focuses on musicianship and music appreciation, central foci of our Mission, Vision, and Purposes. One of the most important aspects of serving bands is one's ability to contribute positively to each rehearsal and performance as a musician, and one of the best ways in which to contribute positively is to be proficient at your instrument. The For Greater Practice Initiative of Tau Beta Sigma was designed to help Chapter members serve their bands by becoming better musicians through the development of good practice habits, especially with regard to the fundamentals of each member's instrument or auxiliary equipment. There are three steps to earn the Black Stripe (deadline to complete and submit tasks is June 1, 2024):

- 1. For at least three months, at least 50% of all Chapters members individually practice for four hours or more. This can be completed with individual or group rehearsal on primary/secondary instruments (including auxiliary equipment). Practice should be tracked for all members using the For Greater Practice Initiative tracking sheet or another preferred method available through your college/university.
- 2. At the conclusion of the For Greater Practice Initiative tracking, host a mini-recital (either privately as a Chapter or including participation of other band members) to perform selected rehearsed pieces and celebrate one another's progress.
- 3. Share the completed tracking sheet (or report from school-based tracker), photos/video from the minirecital and details of the event, and answer the questions "How did this event impact our community?



The Lyre Pieces are an opportunity to expand the Chapter's involvement in aspects of the Sorority outside of the primary National Programs and Mission-driven initiatives.

The Left Lyre Piece focuses on celebration, recognition, and achievement within our Chapters and bands. Tau Beta Sigma offers a number of recognition opportunities to celebrate the musical and academic achievements of our Chapter and band members including the Academic Achievement Program, Service Certificate, and For Greater Bands Award. There is one step to earn the Left Lyre Piece (deadline to complete and submit tasks is June 1, 2024):

1. Submit an application for an Academic Achievement Program award, Service Certificate, and/or For Greater Bands award.*

*Each of these recognition/awards types has specific deadlines during an academic year. Applications that are submitted on-time for the respective deadline will be considered for the Left Lyre Piece.

The Center Lyre Piece connects each Chapter to their District-specific projects and initiatives. Review the steps to earn the Center Lyre Piece for each District (deadline to complete and submit tasks is June 1, 2024):

- Midwest: Attend and contribute discussion questions at least one of two DEIA-focused District events
- North Central: Host an event focused on Chapter growth as part of the NCD Cadenza Program
- Northeast: Complete a service project in line with the "Harmony in Motion" initiative
- Southeast: Conduct a service project as part of the SED "Service Project Swap" Program
- Southwest: Participate each month in the District Photo Challenge
- Western: Host an event with Alumni Members of the Chapter to build connections

Detailed information and requirements for each District Project for the Center Lyre Piece can be found on the national website at www.tbsigma.org/focuson5 and on the TBSigma Discord server.

The **Right Lyre Piece** encourages Chapters to engage with Sorority events throughout the year. During the upcoming academic year there will be a series of events focused on Chapter operations, professional development, and musicianship and band appreciation. These events are made successful by the presence and interaction of members and Chapters from across the country to learn from one another. The tentative calendar of events for this series is available on the Linktree and will be uploaded to the national website. There are two steps to earn the Right Lyre Piece (deadline to complete and submit tasks is June 1, 2024):

- 1. At least one member of the Chapter is present at at least half of the total National Council-sponsored events. This does not need to be the same member for all events.
- 2. After the event series has concluded, submit a post highlighting the events that were attended and the attendees' response to the questions "What were the key takeaways from this event? How did the Chapter grow from the experience?" in the Discord server.


